CHARITY LAW CHANGES!

The <u>Charities (Regulation and Administration) (Scotland) Act 2023</u> is a new piece of legislation that builds on existing charity law in Scotland. Parts of the new Act came into force in April 2024, and parts of the Act aren't in force yet. It's an update of the <u>Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005.</u>

From summer 2025 all charities need to be aware of three important changes that will affect them. The changes relate to:

- Providing trustee details to OSCR and the publication of trustee names
- Publication of all charity accounts
- Automatic disqualification

PROVIDING TRUSTEE INFORMATION TO THE CHARITY REGULATOR OSCR

From summer 2025, it will be mandatory for all charities to <u>provide trustee information via OSCR Online</u>. The exact date for providing trustee information will be announced shortly, however charities are encouraged to start gathering the necessary information now.

Charities will be required to submit the following details for each trustee:

- Full name
- Home address
- Email address
- Telephone number
- Date of birth

This information will support OSCR's regulatory work, and the names of trustees will be published on the Scottish Charity Register from the end of 2025 to promote transparency and strengthen public trust in the sector. This change is part of the Charities (Regulation and Administration) (Scotland) Act 2023.

PUBLICATION OF ALL CHARITY ACCOUNTS

From the end of 2025, every accounts document submitted to OSCR will be publicly available on the Scottish Charity Register for at least five years. These documents will be published exactly as received, and OSCR will no longer redact any personal information from these documents prior to publication.

AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFICATION UPDATES

The revised guidance reflects two significant updates:

- Automatic disqualification will also apply to individuals undertaking a senior management function – The automatic disqualification provisions will no longer apply solely to charity trustees. They will also cover employees and volunteers undertaking senior management functions, regardless of job title, and these functions are detailed in the guidance.
- Extended disqualification criteria There are additional criteria that will automatically disqualify individuals from serving as a charity trustee or holding a senior management function in a charity. For example, someone convicted of terrorism-related offences or listed on the sex offenders register will now be automatically disqualified.

NHS SHETLAND - WASTE AND REUSE PORTAL

NHS Shetland is in the process of introducing **Warp It** to reduce procurement costs, waste and carbon emissions. The beauty of the system is that it is a legal mechanism for claiming or disposing of assets - the contractual side is taken care of in the portal itself and no money changes hands.

In NHS Shetland we are positive that a circular economy between NPOs in Shetland offers huge benefits to the community. If we increase the scale and scope by having a Shetland-wide approach, then community groups, charities and schools could benefit from items that would otherwise enter the waste stream. Warp It have made registering FREE to schools and registered charities.

THE DISCLOSURE (SCOTLAND) ACT 2020 IS NOW LIVE!

There are big changes for voluntary sector organisations as a result of the Disclosure (Scotland) Act 2020.

Key updates include:

- Membership of the PVG scheme will be a legal requirement from 1st April 2025 for those carrying out a regulated role.
- There will be a 3-month grace period from the 1st April, 2025 30th June,
 2025 to apply for membership of the PVG scheme where required.
- The concept of 'regulated work' has been replaced with 'regulated roles', making it more easily understood. This includes roles for charity trustees and board or committee members.

The 'Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities' ('the SORP') provides recommendations and requirements for preparing charity accounts in accordance with UK accounting standards. It has been updated following an extensive development process informed by the views of engagement partners and a sector specific SORP Committee.

CALLS FOR VIEWS: THE SCOTTISH PARLIAMENT IS OPEN TO HEARING YOUR VIEWS ON A RANGE OF TOPICS:

HEALTH: LONG TERM CONDITIONS FRAMEWORK

Closes: 20th July 2025

Many people in Scotland live with the challenges of a long-term condition; recently reported as 38% of our population. As some condition-specific Scottish Government policies approach the end of their planned duration, they have begun reviewing our approach with the launch of a consultation on the Long-Term Conditions Framework as it looks to prioritise areas for improvement.

DRAFT JUST TRANSITION PLAN FOR TRANSPORT, Deadline: 19 May 2025

The Scottish Government is consulting on their draft Just Transition Plan for Transport. The Plan identifies the key challenges and opportunities currently facing the transport sector. It highlights the work that is already taking place, while setting out an approach and priorities for the future.

COMMUNITY WEALTH BUILDING (SCOTLAND) BILL

Closes: 23 May 2025

The <u>Economy and Fair Work Committee</u> wants to hear your views on the <u>Community Wealth Building (Scotland) Bill</u>.
