THIRD SECTOR NEWS

THE DISCLOSURE (SCOTLAND) ACT 2020 IS NOW LIVE!

There are big changes for voluntary sector organisations as a result of the Disclosure (Scotland) Act 2020.

Key updates include:

- Membership of the PVG scheme will be a legal requirement from 1st April 2025 for those carrying out a regulated role.
- There will be a 3-month grace period from the 1st April, 2025 30th June,
 2025 to apply for membership of the PVG scheme where required.
- The concept of 'regulated work' has been replaced with 'regulated roles', making it more easily understood. This includes roles for charity trustees and board or committee members.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT...DISABILITY RELATED EXPENDITURE, TUESDAY 29 APRIL, ONLINE

Join this short online session by <u>Coalition of Carers in Scotland</u>, gain an insight into how charging for social care services works and learn about the Disability Related Expenditure that local authorities should be taking into account when deciding what people can afford to pay.



<u>HOMICIDE TIMELINE, FREE WEBINAR, 13TH MAY FROM 10AM – 12PM</u> (No Booking Required)

A free webinar on the homicide timeline will take place on. The Homicide Timeline is a framework for understanding risk escalation patterns in intimate partner relationships where Coercive Control and Stalking are present. The Timeline represents a typical journey identified in research which explains how and why risk may be escalating.

The webinar training is designed for professionals who respond to disclosures of domestic abuse or stalking, and those who manage offenders. It explains what Coercive Control and Stalking are, and what the patterns might look like. The training focuses on the perpetrator's thinking and motivations. This taster session is designed to give a brief introduction and overview to the Homicide Timeline.

The training is presented by Professor Jane Monckton Smith and her team and includes Jane explaining the research background to the Homicide Timeline, providing her expertise on Coercive Control and Stalking as well as presentation slides and films from families bereaved through Intimate Partner Homicide.

SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT SECTOR-LED REVIEW OF CHARITY REGULATION

The Scottish Government has <u>published an independent analysis report</u> for the consultation on a review of charity regulation. It asked whether a review of charity regulation was needed and if so, what should be reviewed and why.

LEGISLATION

CALLS FOR VIEWS: <u>THE SCOTTISH PARLIAMENT IS OPEN TO HEARING YOUR VIEWS ON A RANGE OF TOPICS</u>:

BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE (SCOTLAND) ACT 2015 INQUIRY

Closes: 2 May 2025

<u>The Equalities, Human Rights and Civil Justice Committee</u> will be considering the impact of the British Sign Language (Scotland) Act 2015. It would like to find out your views on whether the act, the current BSL National Plan and listed authority plans are improving the lives of BSL users; and on what changes could be made in the shorter and longer term to improve the lives of BSL users.

COST-EFFECTIVENESS OF PUBLIC INQUIRIES

Closes: 9 May 2025

The <u>Finance and Public Administration Committee</u> like to hear your views on the cost-effectiveness of public inquiries. The committee's investigation will include how and why public inquiries are established, whether they deliver value for money and the extent to which spending controls are necessary.

COMMUNITY WEALTH BUILDING (SCOTLAND) BILL

Closes: 23 May 2025

The <u>Economy and Fair Work Committee</u> wants to hear your views on the <u>Community Wealth Building (Scotland) Bill</u>. The committee would like to know whether the bill will achieve its aim, whether there are potential unintended consequences to the bill and how the bill could benefit local communities and small businesses.

NATURAL ENVIRONMENT (SCOTLAND) BILL

Closes: 9 May 2025

The Rural Affairs and Islands Committee is looking for your views on the <u>Natural Environment</u> (Scotland) Bill which aims to help restore nature and protect biodiversity in Scotland.
